Scholarship/ Fellowship Report: Reatha

- 2014 Awards: \$67,450 (144 recipients)
- 92 campuses awarded
- 58 organizations awarded
- 51 campuses submitted one application
- 12 campuses submitted two or more applications
- 3 Founders and Anniversary Scholarships awarded (\$1,000)
- 9 Parker F. Enright Scholarships awarded (\$750)
- 82 Patrick W. Halloran Scholarships awarded (\$500)
- 49 Dr. Kent L. Gardner Scholarships awarded (\$300)
- We awarded inaugural \$2,000 Daisy Wood Scholarship (MacKenzie Johnson, Univ of Washington)
- Awarded 2 Doctoral (\$2,000) and 8 Masters Fellowships (\$1,000) for total of \$12,000.
